# **CyberPatriot XIV National Finals Competition**

The CyberPatriot XIV National Finals Competition is set for March 18-20, 2022. The event will be conducted as a hybrid event with some teams competing in-person at the Bethesda North Marriott in Rockville, Maryland and others competing virtually from their home locations. The event kicks off on March 18 with the Opening Ceremony (live-streamed at 10:00 AM ET on <u>CyberPatriot's YouTube</u> channel), followed by Competition Orientation and System Familiarization in the afternoon, and The Career Portal/Industry Perspectives (TCP/IP) event in the evening.

The main event - competition day – will go all day on Saturday, March 19, starting with the Northrop Grumman Foundation Network Security Master Challenge (with AT&T and CyberPatriot Web-based components) and wrapping with the Cisco NetAcad Challenge.

The National Finals Competition (and CyberPatriot XIV season) culminates the evening of Sunday, March 20, at the Awards Banquet. Here, the winning teams are announced and deemed National Champions. Additional information about the live-stream of the awards ceremony will be shared closer to the event date.

#### The Challenges

Northrop Grumman Foundation Network Security Master Challenge (with AT&T and CyberPatriot Web- based components)	During this challenge, teams are provided with a variety of operating system images and an AT&T- sponsored cybersecurity inject. Each team serves as administrators for a small business, responsible for maintaining servers and network services. Teams must find and fix vulnerabilities, maintain critical services, resolve injects (including the AT&T Component), and defend against hostile Red Team attackers.
Cisco NetAcad Challenge	During the Cisco NetAcad Challenge, teams are scored on their ability to demonstrate proficiency in network security administration. Teams are challenged to utilize their members efficiently to complete all aspects of the challenge in the allotted time. Cybersecurity knowledge and skills are tested with a networking quiz and a Packet Tracer network simulation exercise.

#### CyberPatriot says Goodbye to an AFA Legend



David T. "Buck" Buckwalter was the Air Force Association's Executive Vice President from 2008 to 2012 and he played a key role in launching the CyberPatriot Program. Under Buck's leadership, the CyberPatriot pilot program with eight teams and the first full season of CyberPatriot were a success that quickly gained the attention of program sponsors. After his retirement, Buck continued to be a strong supporter of CyberPatriot and helped launch AFA's StellarXplorers program. Buck passed away on February 27 at the age of 72.

Prior to his time with AFA, Buck served 27 years in the U.S. Air Force as a weapons officer,

logistician, and a Naval War College instructor. Buck earned a master's degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College and retired from the Air Force with a rank of Colonel.


#### Waterloo Career Center team places in top half of CyberPatriot competition | By Andrew Wind, The Courier
