Upcoming Training Opportunities:

Training Round: September 4 – October 22

The Training Round will have several basic training images with answer keys available. This is the best training opportunity for new teams. Scores will not count towards the competition.

Practice Round: October 6 – October 20

The Practice Round is a re-release of the Training Round images. However, it is also a test of the CCS software for host computers and networks. It is critical for teams to participate with at least one connecting image to troubleshoot any problems prior to the competition round.

CyberPatriot 18 Rules Book Updates and Clarifications:

- Image Answers will be published when Rounds 1 and 2 and the Middle School Introductory Rounds are completed. Teams will not be able to share their how-to's, scripts, or other competition materials.
- The National Commissioner must approve the registration of all teams with special cases such as composite teams and teams with the "Other" organization designation.
- All competitors on a team must belong to the organization to which the team is registered.
- A coach registering without an email address of the organization a team belongs to must be verified by the principal or vice-principal or assistant principal.
- Teams are not permitted to share Unique IDs, passwords, or other competition credentials with people outside of their teams.
- US Naval Sea Cadets teams will be registering within the Open Division this season.

What are you up to now?

I'm currently a software engineer at Google working in Google Cloud.

How did participating in the CyberPatriot competition influence your plans for your future?

CyberPatriot exposed me to careers in information security and supplemented my technical programming skills. Although I'm not a security engineer, I work in a cybersecurity-related service at Google and having prior CyberPatriot experience gave me some foundational knowledge related to my work, such as encryption and networking.

What was the most valuable lesson you learned from CyberPatriot?

Cybersecurity is important! CyberPatriot taught me early on that cybersecurity is a huge point of emphasis for most organizations, especially ones that deal

with our personal data. As cyber-attacks become more sophisticated, it pays to stay informed and protect yourself from potential malware and data theft. The more you can prepare, the better off you will be (both in the

CyberPatriot competition and in real life situations). No matter what kind of work you do, security will be

extremely relevant, so having the knowledge is always helpful.

Also, don't forget the importance of teamwork! Everyone has their own strengths they bring to the table and working effectively together benefits everybody.

CyberPatriot Program Highlight: CyberGenerations


