Scholarships, Awards, and Some Changes at The National Finals Competition

Shortly, 28 teams with more than 200 National Finalists Competitors will arrive in Washington, D.C., for the CyberPatriot VI National Finals Competition, March 26-30. The teams will be vying for national titles and more than \$50,000 in scholarships from CyberPatriot's Presenting Sponsor the Northrop Grumman Foundation. Top teams in specific competition events will be recognized by the event sponsor.

This season, the competition will have four weighted events instead of the usual three. Middle school teams will compete in two of the events indicated with an asterisk (*):

- Network Security Master Challenge* Leidos Digital Forensics Cisco Networking Challenge
- U.S. Cyber Crime Conference Digital Crime Scene Challenge*

The events have changed, too. In the Network Security Master Challenge teams will have their Internet access limited to a "whitelist" of approved websites and will secure a mobile device. The Networking and Digital Forensics Challenges have been significantly upgraded from last season. Physical evidence collection in a simulated crime scene will be scored in the Digital Crime Scene Challenge.

The Northrop Grumman Foundation and our other sponsors have planned for a world class event. Leading up to the competition the Competitors will interact with our sponsors' cyber professionals. A Competitors' Dinner will be hosted by Northrop Grumman so that Competitors will have a chance to mingle with their peers and meet CyberPatriot sponsors. Door prizes for the dinner will include cameras, backpacks, and an iPad Mini, all graciously provided by our sponsors.

Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University Offering \$5,000 Scholarship to CyberPatriot Competitors

Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University will award a merit scholarship in the amount of up to \$5,000 per year of attendance to high school seniors who are active members of a CyberPatriot team at any high school in the country or its territories. Each student who applies for the scholarship must meet the regular academic requirements for admission, as well as meeting requirements for scholarship retention.

To apply for one of the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University CyberPatriot scholarships:

- Complete an Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University CyberPatriot Scholarship Application (including essay on CyberPatriot involvement—500 words or less)
- Complete an Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University application for admission
- Submit a high school transcript which should include, at minimum, the grades from the final semester/marking period of the junior year
- Submit all SAT and/or ACT test scores

Your completed application must be received **no later than March 15th** of your senior year. We request that you return the ABOVE REQUIRED MATERIALS to the address below. If Embry-Riddle has already received your application for admission, please indicate this on your scholarship application.

Cyber Defenders by Day, Heroes by Night: Members of Colorado Springs Cadet Squadron Save Man's Life

A missing 66-year-old Kansas man suffering from Alzheimer's Disease was found alive in Colorado following a six-county search after the man's SUV got stuck in a field over the weekend, and it's all thanks to the members of the Colorado Springs Civil Air Patrol Squadron (CSCS).

The CSCS ground team, led by Lt. Col. Bill McNeely, included three cadets (and CyberPatriot Competitors): Cadets Kyle Fields, Carlin Idle and Samuel Tschappler. "I had three qualified cadets with me, 16- and 17-year-olds," said McNeely. "I only take my older cadets on actual missions. I know they're trained and they'll do a good job."

CAP provides search and rescue services nation-wide using its own aircraft in conjunction with trained ground teams. CAP is the official U.S. Air Force auxiliary and is open to all U.S. citizens age 12 and older.
